





Minutes of the PSCC Board Meeting on February 21, 2022

Present via Zoom were President Jack Broom, Vice-President Mercedes Perez, Treasurer Yvonne Shimek, Print Director Chris Currie and Member-at-Large Henry Heerschap.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Jack Broom reminded members of March 19 event at Kenmore Camera and said he will send a reminder message to membership. At least 16 members have signed up and more are welcome. Members are free to invite guests.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mercedes Perez said the club's next Education Night will be in May. She may seek a speaker from within club membership. It was noted that Bill Ray and Bill Royce have done Education Nights in the past.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Yvonne Shimek circulated a report noting that the club's most recent total for funds on hand was \$2,638. The Treasurer's Report was accepted.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Comments indicate the last hybrid Digital Night went quite well, but the club may want to purchase a better microphone so that the makers' comments made by people at the church can be heard by those participating online.

NEW BUSINESS

Jack noted that he had appointed Lauren Heerschap to the Nominating Committee and that the membership appointed Lynne Greenup. He said Linda Charboneau was willing to be the Board's appointee to the committee. The Board voted unanimously to appoint her to that position. The Nominating Committee's job is to nominate a slate of candidates for the positions open in June: President, Print Director, Secretary and Member-at-Large.

Jack briefly discussed the opportunity to exhibit a show of our members' work for three months next year at the Edmonds Waterfront Gallery. Jack confirmed that the club would like to do this, but noted there are a fair amount of decisions to be made about how we organize and staff this. He suggested we invite membership input and form a committee. Henry said he would be interested in working on this.

NWCCC Conference news: Kristi Odom, an accomplished wildlife photographer and Nikon Ambassador, has been recruited to be the keynote speaker at the conference in November. Organizers also believe they are close to naming a venue.

Next PSCC Board meeting will be held via Zoom March 21, 2022.

Useful Web Links

Is your camera up to date? In many cases, our cameras have been updated by the maker with **revised firmware**. Most of the time, these address bugs found along the way and are fairly minor. However, in a number of cases they've added features or significantly improved performance in auto-focus and other camera functions. PetaPixel recently published a comprehensive article on what firmware is and how to find out if you need it for your gear. https://petapixel.com/2022/01/31/how-to-vupdate-your-cameras-firmware/

Something we do in camera club is **analyze photos**, both our own and our fellow members' work. Andrew S. Gibson has provided an excellent primer on how to go about analysis- what to look for and how to think about what we're seeing: https://www.creative-photographer.com/analyze-photos/

Many of us use **Lightroom Classic** as the first stage of processing our images. The Develop module has a number of powerful tools we can use to get the most out of the photo. The process gets better when we learn many of the **shortcuts** for getting around the module. Gibson has a good list of shortcuts you may not be aware of: https://mastering-lightroom.com/hidden-lightroom-shortcuts/
