





PSCC Board Meeting Minutes on October 16, 2023

Held on Zoom

Present were Chris Currie, Henry Heerschap, Yvonne Shimek, and Bob Sotak.

The meeting was called to order by Chris Currie at 7:05 pm. The minutes of September 18, 2023, were moved to be accepted, seconded, and passed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

No nominee for either President or Secretary of the NWCCC has been identified. The matter has been continued to the NWCCC Board Meeting on January 13, 2024. If anyone is interested in being nominated to either position or knows someone who is should contact Lynne Greenup.

The field trip to Kubota Garden on August 13 was attended by seven members. Fall color was just starting but all had a good time.

Jack Graham, the speaker scheduled to speak in person at the NWCCC Conference on November 11, 2023, will not be able to appear due to health issues. John Pedersen will speak instead on the same or similar subjects.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Vice-President Mercedes Perez was unable to attend. She is working on getting a speaker for the October 30, 2023 education night. SPS has invited PSCC to attend Darrel Gulin's presentation at SPS on October 24.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Yvonne Shimek reported that the financial records for fiscal year July 1 2022, through June 30, 2023, have been audited by Mary Tevis and no errors were found. Yvonne also reported that there was \$1,501.19 in the club's bank account as of October 16, 2023. The Treasurer's

report was moved to be accepted, seconded, and passed. Yvonne reported that Mary Tevis will not be auditing the books next year and we will have to find someone else to do it.

OLD BUSINESS:

The transition to the Visual Pursuits web hosting system continues and is expected to be completed by the end of the year at the latest. Bob Sotak will be reaching out directly to several people to form a group to meet on Zoom and engage in a 'field trial' of the new web site with a follow up meeting to discuss any issues that came up during the 'field trial'. These people are expected to learn enough about the new website and system so that they can help other members during the transition. The January digital night will be run using the new web site. Changes to the voting system will be addressed after the transition is complete.

NEW BUSINESS:

Henry requested authorization to use the PSCC projector, screen, and other items necessary for the speaker at the NWCCC conference on November 11. It was moved, seconded and passed that such authorization be given.

The holiday party in December was discussed. A preliminary decision was made to have pizza for those attending in person as well as a white elephant exchange again this year. Further details will be decided at the next board meeting.

The next Board meeting will be November 20, 2023, at 7:00 pm on Zoom. Members of the club are invited to attend. Please let Chris Currie know fi you would like to be present and she will send you a link.
