Useful Web Links

Entering photography competitions can be an excellent way to advance your work and gain recognition (and occasionally win prizes!) The North American Nature Photography Association (NANPA) is an excellent resource for information on nature photography. I (Henry) have been a member for years, partly because of their excellent equipment insurance program. Recently, they posted a two part series on **Navigating**

Photography Contests, Competitions, and Exhibitions. Debbie McCulliss describes the different types of event and highlights the pitfalls to avoid when entering, especially the notorious "rights grab" that unscrupulous sponsors attempt.









Minutes of the PSCC Board Meeting on August 15, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 pm.

Present on Zoom were President Chris Currie, Secretary Mary Tevis, Treasurer Yvonne Shimek, Digital Director Bob Sotak, Print Director Henry Heerschap, Member at Large Michael Hrankowski, PSA Representative Dave Patzwald, and club member Jack Broom.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Chris Currie moved to approve the minutes of July 18, 2022; this was seconded and passed.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Mercedes Perez reports that the Point Defiance field trip was successful. Jodee Owens has offered to help research and plan field trips.

Bill Royce will be speaking on education night on August 29, 2022, about black and white photography, and since there are many members out of town on that date, has agreed to record the talk and allow it to be seen for two weeks. Allan Walls will be presenting on October 31, 2022, and because he speaks on macro photography, he would like suggestions for topics. Mercedes Perez is lining up 2023 speakers, with the possibility of Rik Littlefield speaking about Zerene Stacker.

There is a dahlia show at Sky Nursery, and a field trip has been arranged for August 27, 2022, at 2:00 pm. Sky Nursery will be open from 2:00 pm until 6:00 pm. There is a dahlia show held to be formally voted in by the Board. It was moved, seconded, and passed. by the Snohomish City Dahlia Society on August 20, 2022, in Everett. Michael Hrankowski reports that the Northwest Orchid Society will hold a showing and Mercedes Perez will look into that and let us know.

She is also planning more field trips and will let the club know when they are firmed up.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

There is a balance of \$2119.32 in the club checking account as of July 31, 2022. A motion was The meeting was adjourned at 8:02 pm. made to approve the treasurer's report; it was seconded and passed.

An auditor is needed for the financial books for the club. Mary Tevis has volunteered to audit the club's books. Thank you, Mary Pease, for performing this task for many years.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Michael Hrankowski brought up a questionnaire for the club to find out what members would like to see in the club, and he and Henry Heerschap will get together and discuss this. Bob Sotak reports there are ongoing issues with digital night, and he would like the word "issue" to be changed to "conversation."

The Edmonds Waterfront Center Gallery Exhibition committee is meeting Tuesday, and therefore there is no update as of today.

Dave Patzwald says that the first round for the PSA competition is starting again. October 15, 2022, is the first round for the 2022-2023 year, and he will need entries by September 15, 2022. An email was sent on Auust 19, 2022, to members of the club containing the rules.

NEW BUSINESS:

Henry Heerschap has an idea for a way to improve and simplify the digital image submission process. He will work with Bob Sotak to test it and if it is workable.

Members have been assisting Mercedes Perez in suggesting field trips: Lynne Greenup was suggested as a lead for a trip to the Skagit, and Henry Heerschap suggested the Georgetown Steam Plant.

The president of the club, Chris Currie, will be taking over as the NWCCC delegate and needs

Henry Heerschap said the next meeting for the NWCCC is the second Saturday in September, and the second Saturday in October will be to elect directors of the NWCCC.

The next meeting for the Board of Directors of PSCC is scheduled for October 17, 2022, at 7:00 pm.
