





PSCC Board Minutes - January 16, 2023

Attendance was by Zoom

Present were Chris Currie, Mary Tevis, Yvonne Shimek, Henry Heerschap, Mercedes Perez, Michael Hrankowski, Lynne Greenup, and Dave Patzwald The meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm.

A motion was made to approve the minutes taken on November 17, 2022; it was seconded and passed.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

An increase in club dues took effect as of January 1, 2023. Members were notified by email. The NWCCC Board met January 14, 2023. The NWCCC Conference in November 2023 will be held south of Seattle in 2023, location to be determined, The keynote speaker, Jack Graham, has already been signed up.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S EDUCATION AND FIELD TRIP REPORT:

Several locations for PSCC field trips were suggested, including Juanita Bay, Skagit again. Rik Littlefield will be our speaker for education night on January 30, 2023. He is an expert on Zerene Stacker and will speak with no fee; however, you still need to sign up for the Zoom event.

The presentation will be recorded and available to watch for a few weeks after the presentation so those who are unable to watch it on the 30th can see it later.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Yvonne Shimek reports that as of December 31, 2022, there was a balance of \$1987.73 in the club checking account, A motion was made to accept the report; it was seconded and passed.

She also reports that a Christmas donation of \$350 was donated to the Lynnwood Food Bank and \$350 to the Edmonds Food Bank. The club received verbal thanks from Edmonds and a thank-vou email from Lynnwood.

PRINT DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

There is a January 27, 2023 deadline for club members to submit their entries for the Traveling Image Salon. You may enter up to three images, sizing each to 1920 by 1080 pixels.
