









# **PSCC Board Meeting, February 19, 2024**

Held on Zoom

Present were Chris Currie, Mary Tevis, Mercedes Perez, Henry Heerschap, Lauren Heerschap, and Yvonne Shimek

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 pm.

It was moved to accept the previous minutes of November ??, 2023, and it was seconded and passed.

### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Visual Pursuits has launched and is now part of the club's on-line presence. Thank you, Henry Heerschap and Bob Sotak and Mercedes Perez for all your hard work on getting it up and running.

Andy Royce has agreed to join the committee to re-do the judging system. The annual liability insurance premium was received and paid. The \$440 fee has remained the same for the last few years.

The club has a mail drawer at the church, and Chris Currie has a key to it. When she checked it, she got a few pieces of mail thanking the club for the donations to the food banks as our Christmas donations. She will now check it periodically.

#### **VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT:**

Bill Royce will do a presentation on April 29, 2024 explaining AI in Photoshop. Lauren Heerschap is visiting and she has come up with several field trlip suggestions: There are always the birds on Fir Island; then there is Japanese Iris Garden at Lake Stevens; the Steam Plant is always good for people to photograph; an overnight trip to Oregon for dahlias. Lauren Heerschap has volunteered to investigate the different field trips and will get back to Mercedes Perez. Lynne Greenup has also volunteered to help coordinate fiied trips.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

Yvonne Shimek reports that there is \$1596.65 in the checking account. She will write a check to Bill Royce for his presentation. There was a motion to accept the treasurer's which was seconded and moved unanimously.

### **VISUAL PURSUITS:**

Henry Heerschap reports that the program is up and running for the digital section of the club. Bob Sotak and Henry Heerschap want to keep it up and running for the next three months. The print night will be run as in the past, but since there is more work to be done for the end-of-year awards and archiving data, these tasks will not be integrated yet into Visual Pursuits. All club members will received emails with instructions for entering their images in the end-of-year competition.

Please start thinking of replacing the secretary, Mary Tevis, with someone, as she is retiring as of June 2024.

The next Board meeting will be March 18, 2024, at 7 pm via Zoom.
