Website Tip: Membership List

You can look up fellow members of PSCC on the website by clicking on Club/Membership List. You can then search by Last Name, First Name, or email address. If you want to see the entire list, click Show All Active Users. Once you locate a particular member you can see as much information as they've allowed to be visible.

If you wish to change how much is visible about you, go to My Account/My Account Settings. If you click Update Personal Profile and Organization Options, you can change your email address, phone number, and other info. If you wish to restrict access to your info, go down to the privacy section and check the appropriate boxes. If you want to add your physical address, go back to User Profile and click on Update Addresses. If you want to add a photo or other image to your account, click on Change Avatar image.

Note that the website and membership administrators have access to your info regardless of which options you click.









PSCC Board Meeting, April 15, 2024

PSCC Board Meeting on April 14, 2024 at 7:00 PM Held on Zoom

Present were Chris Currie, Mary Tevis, Mercedes Perez, Henry Heerschap, Bob Sotak, Michael Hrankowski and Lauren Heerschap. The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm.

It was moved to accept the previous minutes of March 19, 2024 and it was seconded and passed into the record.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

The NWCCC is still looking for a president and a secretary.

Jack Broom has agreed to be head of the nominating committee this year.

The judges have been set for the year-end competition: Darrell Gulin for Creative, Greg Gilbert for photojournalism, the F67 club for digital images, and for prints, Sam Ruljancich and Alan Moody.

Chris Currie has contacted the company that makes the club's plaques and ribbons and notified them of the dates, and the company said they will get them done by the due date.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

Mercedes Perez has contacted the editor of ICM Magazine and found she, Stephanie Johnson, does presentations on Zoom, and she will be willing to speak on intentional camera movement. Henry Heerschap has been tapped for a Zoom presentation on infrared photography by a camera club on the East Coast and he would like to offer it to at some other time to PSCC and SPS.

We need more registrants for our education night with Bill Royce on Al on April 29. Henry Heerschap reports that the invitation is going out to SPS.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Yvonne Shimek reports that there is \$2111.53 currently in the club checking account. The reason for the better number is that people are paying their dues and we have gained new members.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Henry Heerschap reports that the Visual Pursuits program is up and running for the digital section of the club, and the gallery is looking better with more images. Chris Currie is wondering if anyone did critiques this month. Bob Sotak and Henry Heerschap want to keep it up and running for the next three months. The print night will be run as in the past, but jpeg's have to be entered on Visual Pursuits. Since there is more work to be done for the end-of-year awards and archiving data, these tasks will not be integrated yet into Visual Pursuits.

Henry Heerschap says that pursuant to the new email system, Moosend, there are licensing problems and other problems with Google, which have to be worked out, but he is slowly getting there. He wants to establish a monthly announcement email with monthly information on it. We need someone to tend it, so we need a volunteer.

Year-end awards will be on June 10, 2024, which is June digital night. The question was raised about what to offer for food, and pizza was suggested; however, Lauren Heerschap suggested we do something else, and that the various taco stores offer catered meals, so Chris Currie will look into it. We will charge \$20 per attendee.

Henry Heerschap will do the slide show of the winners.

The nominating committee needs to have one member chosen by the president, one chosen by the Board, and a third elected from the total membership. We will vote on a member at May digital night. The president chose Jack Broom. The Board needs to choose a representative on the nominating committee.

The only position that needs to be filled on the Board is the secretary.

The next Board meeting will be May 13, 2024, at 7 pm via Zoom.
