It's a new year and a great opportunity to learn new techniques or refine old ones. One tool a lot of us rely on is **Focus Stacking**. Whether you are doing macro or landscape, focus stacking can be useful. The folks at DIY Photography have put together a fairly comprehensive overview on the subject here:
